

# PE and Sports Premium Funding Report

# 2013/14

For the 2013/14 Academic Year, Victoria Park Primary Academy has received **£9,740** of funding from the PE and Sports Premium funding to develop and consider the impact of:

- Achievement in weekly PE lessons;
- Increased participation in competitive school sport;
- Personal health and well-being; and
- Improved attitudes and behaviour towards learning

As a School, we have been focusing on key areas of development for PE and Sport that feed into our Action Plans for the year and beyond. These areas are:

- 1. Increased participation and engagement in a range of sports and clubs
- 2. Development of Teachers skills in particular sports
- 3. Participation in Competitive sports
- 4. The Quality of regular PE lessons for children
- 5. Resources and equipment to support these actions

This report outlines the impact and progress made in these areas over the last year and how plans to continue this move into the following academic year and beyond.

## Increased participation in a range of sports and clubs

Sports Clubs:

• Football Club

Staff are running a football club every Tuesday for this whole academic year, with on average 30 children participating. They have taken part in a number of competitions (see section on Participation in Competitive sports)

Netball Club

A new Netball club has taken place since March, led by a teacher who has received professional development as part of our identified training. 10 pupils have regularly participated in the club and have taken part in competitions (see section on Participation in Competitive sports).

Cricket Club

A new lunch time cricket club has taken place this year – again children have competed in a competition (see section on Participation in Competitive sports)

## Opportunities for raising aspirations and awareness of sports:

- Athlete event: Professional swimmer – we had a whole school event where professional athlete Joanne Jackson gave an aspirational speech about her career as an athlete, and children took part in a sponsored sports activity.



- Professional footballer event one of our Gifted and Talented footballers was invited to attend a special event sponsored by Barratts housing development to meet a retired West Bromwich player.
- Football kit sponsorship to raise the aspiration of the football team, we purchased a new football kit, which was then sponsored by our Accountant.

#### Development of Teachers skills in particular sports

The school has been supported by Shireland Academy to train teachers in a number of sports:

- Gymnastic 3 members of staff trained
- Netball 2 members of staff trained
- Orienteering 1 member of staff

There is also planned training for Hockey (2 staff) and Multi-skills (3 staff)

We have invested time and support for a member of the teaching team to oversee the development of PE and Sport in school. This teacher's role will be further developing in the next academic year where he will be coming out of class to deliver high quality PE in a number of areas in the school.

#### Participation in Competitive sports

- Football League the team have competed in the Hagley League and a series of friendly matches, totaling 10 matches. The team finished 3<sup>rd</sup> out of 9 schools in this league. They also entered a Yearly tournament, reaching the semi-finals out of 12 schools
- Netball Competitions the netball team have played in 7 matches against other schools, and a tournament where they reached the final
- Sports Day in house Sports day that involved the whole school (except nursery). The day including a variety of athletics sports including races, obstacle courses, long jump, and throwing events
- Intersports Competitions 72 children from across the school took part in a Intersports competition at Hagley Stadium, where we competed against 5 other schools
- Tennis competition 11 pupils from Year 3 and 4 took part in a Tennis competition
- Indoor Sports competition 20 children from Year 5 and 6 took part in an Indoor Sports competition
- Cricket Competition 9 Year 5 and 6 pupils took part in a cricket competition which they won

## The Quality of regular PE lessons for children

From Summer 2014, we will be identifying plans for ongoing PE development in school. We have identified a teacher who will be focusing on the delivery of PE and Sport, continuing to build on the teacher training that has commenced this year.



Related to the Sports Premium and the New National Curriculum, we have created a rigorous skills ladder and subject overview for PE to help teachers plan high quality PE lessons. The PE leader has ran a professional development meeting for all staff to share this content across the school.

Observations of the quality of PE lessons will be commencing from September 2014.

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## Identified Opportunities for ongoing development:

We have identified some emerging priorities to focus on in the next year:

- Athletics club: 2 members of staff have elected to run a new club for children to be able to participate in a wide range of athletics, helping us feed more effectively into the Inter-Schools competition and harness children's individual skills
- Rugby: In a very multicultural area, Rugby tends to be a low participation sport however with the creation of a Rugby competition and links with Warley Rugby club, again this will be a new area of sport we are keen to develop in school with a club and training for teachers.
- Ongoing teacher development with the development of a member of staff to lead on PE that has commenced this year, his role will look at the delivery of high quality PE in the school. We will be supporting his professional development as well as continuing to develop other teacher's delivery of PE in the school.
