**Parents Evening:** It was great to see so many families join us to share the children's progress, look at their learning and discuss steps forward this week. Free school Meals/Christmas Holiday Food Vouchers: At present, all families who apply and qualify for Free School Meals are also entitled to other free services, trips and £15 food vouchers, per child, per week during the holidays from Sandwell. Often families in Reception, Years 1 and 2 don't apply because their children already get a free lunch BUT this means you could be missing out on wider support. "Children who miss school, miss out as adults." Secretary of State for Education

"Of pupils who miss between 10 per cent and 20 per cent of primary school, only 35 per cent manage to achieve five A\* to C GCSEs, including English and maths."

This year has seen a huge spike in requests for Leave of absence during term time. Nearly 10% of families have asked for time off. As per Trust and Sandwell guidance we will always deny these requests and, in severe cases, support Sandwell in further actions. We analyse attendance data each week to ensure we identify those at risk of falling below our target of 94% attendance, in these cases we will write out to families or arrange a meeting to discuss how we can support an improvement.
