Transition arrangements: Children are already asking me daily who their new teacher is going to be! Staff have now been informed and we are starting to share our transition arrangements. Children will be informed on Thursday 4th July, before sharing the first of two mornings in their new classrooms. For SEN children facing any new routines, Mrs Kainth our SENCo will share these with families in advance to help manage these.

(24th June) for all Trust Staff to share a joint training day. When the children are back on Tuesday they will join with all children across our Trust to celebrate a year of our values and their recent fact-finding visits.
