School Nurse - visiting for parents today: Based on the great response to the school nurse visiting Nursery last month, we have booked a follow-up session today. If you have any questions or concerns around your child's health or accessing services, please come to the school office today from 2.30pm.

Summer Challenge Packs and Home Learning Guides: Although the Summer term doesn't usually start until after the Easter holidays, we are planning to start our Summer Curriculum early, to reflect the very short 4 week half-term. Next week I will send home the Summer Medium Term Plans and Home Learning guides for all year groups.

Whitehall Infants: Victoria Academies Trust is growing. From April 1st we welcome Whitehall Infant School in Walsall as our 11th partner school. We will be taking a small group of children to take part in their launch day, where Victoria Park pupils can share our Trust Values (Unity, Integrity, Courage, Curiosity and Excellence), and what life is like as part of a VAT school.

Social Media reporting and investigations: I wrote out to all families in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 this week with an updated approach to online misuse that occurs out of school hours. From the recent Sandwell Shape Survey, 56% of local primary aged children have access to TikTok, 43% have access to Snapchat. Again, across Sandwell, 26% of children feel they have been the victim of cyberbullying and 17% have experienced racist language. I will share our approach in assembly on Monday. Identity Workshops and Time to Talk: One way we counter online abuse is through the many external speakers that we invite in to school. This week Year 5 have continued their understanding of personal identity and have been encouraged to recognise their own mental health through Time to Talk sessions.

We were incredibly fortunate to keep hold of Chef Norman and his team, who remain the heart and soul of the kitchen.
